Living Legend Pixie-Bobs By Shari Fedewa



The legend of barneats and bobcats mating is, part of what has intrigued me about the Prixie-Bob, which is a domestic cut bred to resemble the Coastal Red Bobcat. But since there is no DNA proof that these matings actually occurred, it remains just a "Legend". Yet, I marvel at their "bobcattiness"—random spotting, plush coat, lynx tipping on their ears, which are wide at the base and rounded, full chins, short tails, large boning, and a half-closed gaze reminiscent of a hunter. I believe there is truth in The Legend...

However, the growing popularity of the Pixie-Bob is attributed largely to it's domestic dog-like behavior! Many homes artest



to their companion's love of riding in the ear, walking on a leash, playing 'fetch', and hide 'n' seek. They are confident, affectionate and 'benevolent rulers' of dogs. They are a mom's dream-come-true of even being obedient! Being basically quiet, they exchange kittenhood 'meows' for chirps, chilters, and even occasional soft barks and whistles.
